
"Shinkyo Bridge and Takinoo Shrine"

Famous places that were disaster sites



Famous places in Nikko that disappeared and crumbled

Shinkyo Bridge and Takinoo Shrine are representative famous places in Nikko. Did you know that they were damaged by sediment-related disasters? The Ashio Typhoon, which damaged all of Tochigi Prefecture in 1902, caused heavy rain



centered on the Nikko mountains, leading to flooding of the Daiya River. The Shinkyo Bridge was completely washed away and Takinoo Shrine was damaged.

In addition, the sediment-related disaster that occurred in 1966 caused a debris flood in Tengu-sawa, which made massive rocks

rush onto roads near Shiraito Falls, damaged the road approaching Takinoo Shrine, and washed away Takinoo Inari Shrine. For volcano-surrounded Nikko, sedimentrelated disasters are always a "current, close by danger." These famous places convey that side of Nikko to this day.
