Daiyagawa GroundSils Group The Daiya River, which flows from Kegon no Taki Falls, has had frequent disasters caused by debris flows and flooding since ancient times. Construction of the GroundSils Group erosion control structures was started to prevent this in 1919. 130 facilities have been built through now, and they boast the foremost scale in Japan.

The Daiyagawa GroundSils Group improve safety, allowing areas that previously flooded to be used as parks, playing fields, and other facilities. Hydrophilic revetments and fish ladders have also been built, providing an environment suitable for humans and all other living things.
